JUDGING COMMENTS:

This dramatic tale begins with the crash of a Royal Flying Doctor plane where the surviving nurse is washed ashore near uninhabited Emerald Island. Meanwhile Nathan, a famous Australian cricketer buys a bicycle to use in his rehabilitation after a sporting injury. Nathan, finding a tattered message in the old bike's water bottle, sets out to find lost treasure – but instead, finds the marooned nurse. The authors' impressive knowledge about sporting injuries adds authenticity to elements of the plot. This book is tightly edited with a strong structural design with effectively varied illustrations all hand-drawn with coloured pencils on high quality paper. Particularly engaging is the portrait of Nathan the wicketkeeper, looking strong, keen and sporty.
